



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

Bio-Solid Project Progress Update as of December 6, 2012

1) City met with ADEC on Tuesday October 16 in Anchorage

- a. Quayanna Corp. had submitted their permit application for the composting project the week before (Oct. 10).
- b. ADEC wants to keep a clear separation between a temporary solution (stockpiling) and the area under consideration for the composting permit.
- c. Instruction was given to find a separate location if any temporary stockpiling of biosolids is needed.
- d. ADEC suggested we talk to the USCG for a possible location for temporary stockpiling. Peter has had contact with USCG, and we will meet with them soon.

Quayanna Corp. application is available on the ADEC website under solid waste program. Quayanna has a facebook site and a web site that can be found by searching for Kodiak Composting.

2) City met with ADEC and Quayanna for a Project Progress Report, Nov 28

- a. Met with Lori Aldrich, Aimee, Hap, Glen, Mark, and Peter and Aaron Olsen.
- b. ADEC extended the public comment period until Jan. 15, 2013.
- c. Estimate six months for ADEC to respond to all of the public comments.
- d. Public Hearing would only record testimony; Public Meeting would allow a dialog back and forth.
- e. Discussed temporary stockpiling and possible options at land fill.

3) Stockpiling of Bio-Solids (Temporary Solution for Disposal)

- a. No zoning issues for use of USCG property for temporary stock piling of biosolids.
- b. Met with USCG on October 31, and have started the process of requesting use of available land. Submitted request letter to USCG on Friday Nov. 9. USCG has sent our request to California for approval.
- c. Asked the KIB on October 24, if not able to use USCG property, what would be required from a zoning perspective, recognizing December 15 stop date for land filling biosolids? Gibson Cove? KIB said zoning would allow staff-level decision.
- d. City needs ADEC approval of stock piling location and method. CH2MHILL has completed a draft that was reviewed on November 7 by City staff. Plan needs to include details of how, when, where, and particularly closure of the area to make sure it is clean when finished. Stockpile plan was submitted to ADEC solid waste on Thursday Nov. 8. Approval to stockpile at either USCG base site or Gibson Cove received from DEC on December 3.
- e. Ordered liner material; we have two lengths here that should be good for six weeks of stockpile.
- f. Staff working on a monitoring plan to submit to USCG for assurance that the City will pay attention to the stockpiling and monitor the material while in temporary storage.

4) Process Agreements in Place

- a. City Council approved an agreement between City and QDC at the October 25th regular meeting.
- b. Site location agreement. (This agreement was signed between QDC and property owner.)
- c. Wood material agreement (Board approved, working on details)

5) **Permit Timing**

- a. ADEC reviewed the permit application and has advertised the permit for 30-day public comment period; comment period was to end December 3, 2012, but has been extended to January 18, 2013.
- b. ADEC recommended contacting nearby neighbors immediately and preparing them for the public comment period. (Peter is working on this, City provided copies of our composting pilot project final report for information purposes.) The City's final Biosolid Composting Pilot test report is available on line at the City of Kodiak's web site, under Public Works, sewer. The report includes the general process that we used and testing results of the compost at the end of our project. It also includes an overview of what it would take if the City were to have started a composting facility.
- c. ADEC recommended getting a newspaper article written about the project. (ADEC mentioned their discussion with the newspaper reporter earlier.) QDC provided information on composting to the paper.

6) **Project Communication**

- a. Staff has met with several people in person and on the phone. These people stopped by or called.
- b. Met with KIB staff on Oct. 24 for progress update.
- c. Met with Borough Assembly and City Council joint work session for project update.
- d. Attended meeting held by those opposed to composting and composting in Middle Bay on November 23.
- e. Met with KIB staff, Borough Mayor, City staff, and City Mayor, as well as Peter Olson on November 26. Discussed public opposition to project and options.
- f. Staff met with Lori Aldrich, QDC representatives, USCG, and KIB officials on November 28 and November 29 to discuss options and looming Borough deadline.
- g. Met with KIB staff on December 5 and 6 to discuss possible new option of landfill location.
- h. Manager had interview with KMXT on December 5 to discuss project from City perspective.
- i. Staff to meet with local resource to assist in public outreach process.
- j. Planning follow-up meetings with KIB and City staff prior to the Borough's December 15 deadline to discuss any and all options.

RE: Snow Dumping Practice for the City of Kodiak

The City has disposed of its snow into the channel downtown for many years; I would guess since the City began hauling snow off the downtown area this has been the practice.

In 2006, the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (ADEC) completed a study evaluating the impact of snow on near shore marine environments. The general idea of the report is that this practice introduces road salt, sand/grit and other pollutants to the marine environment.

I received an email from Steven Russell an ADEC Environmental Program Manager on Thursday, November 29 saying they had received a call about the City's practice of dumping snow collected from roads and parking lots into the Harbor. As part of the email Steven directed me to contact ADEC's Division of Water as described in the attached brochure.

In the FY 2013 City Budget, we funded a project to look at and evaluate our snow hauling and dumping practices as well as potential for on shore storage locations that can be built into snow dump storage sites. Since receiving the email, I contacted DOWL HKM because I had discussed this project during the budget preparation in FY 2012 and again in FY 2013.

DOWL HKM provided Glenn and me with some existing snow dump studies and additional information about other community's practices.

Glenn and I called and discussed our snow hauling and dumping practices with William Ashton with ADEC Storm Water & Wetlands, Wastewater Discharge Authorization Program on Tuesday, December 4, 2012. We discussed the ADEC's effort to reduce coastal communities from dumping directly into the marine environment and move the communities toward up land snow storage yards that can adequately address potential pollutants as well as sediment and trash.

We spoke with William about the process the City of Kodiak needs to use to move forward from this point. I relayed to William that we would begin an effort to get a project underway to look at locations that can meet the criteria that ADEC uses. The primary criteria are based around the waters receiving any runoff and the ability to manage sediment and pollutants.

I am also going to send William a plan indicating that we would continue to dispose of the snow from Powell Avenue, Upper Mill Bay and the entire Downtown area including City owned parking lots at our existing snow dump off the spit. I intend to include Mill Bay Road in that group as well. For the remaining residential areas, we would haul snow to the area behind the water treatment plant and the area between Larch Street and Lilly Lake. We have used the area by the water treatment plant for years. Many years ago, we used the fill site off of Larch Street. Neither of these two locations has a lot of room, but depending on the snow fall amounts we might be able to divert a significant amount of snow from direct dumping in the harbor.

With the ability to continue to use the downtown snow dump for the areas listed we should not see a major impact to our snow removal cost or timing downtown. We will see a slowdown in time since we will have to modify trucking runs and timing in the residential areas. We may also have to rent some additional equipment if the snow fall demands that we have to stack snow in the storage locations since all our existing equipment is already committed to existing workloads.

I would like to request a proposal from DOWL HKM that we can take to the City Council in January. This proposal will look at possible dump sites both within the City and possible private lands that could be purchased. When talking to DOWL yesterday, we really are looking at locations that are two acres in size or slightly larger to be really effective. This might bring Near Island into discussions. Most of the other locations I can think of now have major drainage short comings downstream from the sites. In order to build an approved snow dump, the drainage downstream is really one of the key components.

Hopefully we can get into the evaluation far enough over the next few months to have a budget number we can work with for funding a snow dump area.

Another consideration to think about is what do we do with private contractors' request to use the snow dump working for local businesses? Currently several of the smaller contractors haul snow for private and other public agencies. The local State DOT uses the snow dump on occasions as well.

SNOW DISPOSAL ON MARINE ICE AND IN OPEN MARINE WATER

PURPOSE: To establish policy regarding emergency snow disposal options that are acceptable to the Department of Environmental Conservation, Division of Water.

APPLICABILITY: This policy is issued by the Department of Environmental Conservation, Division of Water. They apply to public agencies and private businesses disposing of snow in the State of Alaska.

Disposal of snow into fresh water, including lakes, streams, wetlands, rivers, estuaries, or tidally influenced streams or rivers, either frozen or unfrozen, without a permit is not allowed.

EMERGENCY SNOW DISPOSAL – Marine Waters Only

Under extraordinary conditions, when all land-based snow disposal options are exhausted, disposal of snow that is not obviously contaminated with road salt, sand, and other pollutants may be allowed in certain waterbodies under certain conditions. In these dire situations, the Department of Environmental Conservation, Division of Water Quality must be notified before disposing of snow in a waterbody.

Use the following guidelines in these emergency situations:

- a. For small communities bordering the sea coast, it is permissible to push (not haul) clean, freshly fallen snow from adjacent parking lots and streets into marine waters. Hauling can introduce additional pollutants, including debris.
- b. Dispose of snow in open water with adequate mixing to prevent ice dams from forming.
- c. Do not dispose of snow in saltmarshes, vegetated wetlands, shellfish beds, mudflats, Special Management Areas designated by state or federal resource agencies, or areas of critical environmental concern.
- d. Do not dispose of snow where trucks may cause shoreline damage or erosion.
- e. Consult with the local government or municipality to ensure that snow disposal in open water complies with local ordinances and bylaws.
- f. Remove accumulated trash and debris from the disposal area as they become visible. Debris in surface water is a water quality violation. Wastes and litter that become uncovered as the snow melts need to be picked up before off-site migration of the waste becomes a problem. Sites that are littered with trash tend to act as magnets for additional unpermitted dumping of wastes.
