The Salvation Army Kodiak Transitional Housing Program Summary

- A transitional housing program for up to 10 men and up to 6 women without children who are in need of shortterm, clean and sober, structured transitional housing
- •
- Clients attend weekly recovery and case management sessions with a Registered Addiction Specialist to ensure all efforts are made so they can reach their housing and recovery plans and move towards self-sufficiency
- •
- The program is available to Alaska Native and non-native residents of the Kodiak Island area, including several small villages; with preference given to those individuals who have successfully completed an alcohol or substance abuse program and are transitioning back to the community

- The program has an ADA unit that can accommodate clients who are in need of short-term recovery after a
 medical procedure and Alaska Natives from villages traveling to Kodiak for medical care resulting from alcohol or
 substance abuse issues

- In the past the transitional housing program has obtained funding from the Alaska Housing and Finance Corporation, we are submitting a grant proposal for FY2015 to continue transitional housing services and add additional greatly needed permanent housing and homeless prevention services for the community as well
