RE: City Manager Report

In addition to routine administrative matters and in preparation of topics and business action items on the Council's work session and meeting agendas, following is a summary of tasks that the City Manager's Office has been working on this past quarter:

## **Administration:**

- New Fire Station Now that Council has approved final design work with Wolf Architecture and selection of a general contractor has been made, we are motivated to begin conversations on the project schedule. We'll be meeting on the 24<sup>th</sup> to identify aspects of the work that may involve early solicitations, procurement determined to be advantageous to the project, acceptable to the City and attainable by the design team. A project kick-off meeting with owner, designer and contractor will take place in Anchorage on April 7, 2023. We continue to maintain the <a href="Kodiak Fire Station Replacement (kodiakfs.blogspot.com">Kodiakfs.blogspot.com</a>) blog.
- Working closely with EPA and USDA Rural Development on final guidance for the community grant programs to access Lift Station 5 (\$3.25M) and Fire Station (\$7M) construction funding.
- Re-entry Coalition Program Working with a group of volunteer stakeholders to formalize a Kodiak-based program to reduce the recidivism rate of returning citizens. As a part of a statewide, community-based effort, the mission of the Kodiak Reentry Coalition is to create and maintain an inclusive, healing environment for individuals returning to the community from incarceration. They pledge to educate and advocate for reentrants from all walks of life in a concerted effort to inspire long-term change and success. To date, we've offered Police Chief Putney as a resource to the local governing board as they secure funding and formalize organization and operations.
- Gibson Cove Stakeholders Group meeting Attended an informal meeting of stakeholders on March 16<sup>th</sup> to listen to ideas on how to best make use of the property, how to accommodate various interests and to chart a path forward. We'll be proposing a line-item in the FY 2024 budget to conduct a thorough and documented planning effort with wide public participation.
- The Manager submitted the 2018 Pacific Cod Disaster Relief Funding proposal to the Pacific States Marine Fisheries Commission in February and received unofficial word on 3/21/23 that our proposal for \$800,134 was approved. The funding will be utilized to improve infrastructure and increase service capacity to the Pacific cod commercial fisheries in Kodiak by adding three electric pedestals in the Shipyard for fleet maintenance and

- replacement of antiquated equipment to repair the fleet locally which decreases out of pocket expenses overall due to unplanned equipment repairs. Once we receive official notification, we'll bring to Council for formal acceptance of the funding.
- KANA Marketplace Parking Lot Design Working with Bristol Engineering to complete redesign documents in an effort to maximize number of parking spaces to accommodate all businesses in the area, improve traffic flow to allow access to Rezanof Drive and hopefully eliminate congestion. Work on the design will address existing conditions of the parking lot and adjacent facilities including but not limited to pavement condition, drainage features, pedestrian pathways, utilities, light poles, signage, and access points. Once drafted, we'll present options to the Council at a future work session. Design of the new parking lot will be finalized by May 2023 and per our Site License agreement with Cornerstone, they will repave and repaint parking lines.
- Meeting with Commander, US Navy Region Northwest Rear Adm. Mark Sucato with Mayor Branson and Harbormaster during his first visit to Alaska and Kodiak on April 21st. Navy Region Northwest oversees the Navy's shore infrastructure that supports Navy vessels operating at sea and Alaska is one of 11 states in their area of operations. Per his request, we'll also be providing Adm. Sucato a tour of Harbor facilities and discuss any future needs of the Navy in the Kodiak area.
- Received news from the National Park Service, Washington D.C. office this morning that the City of Kodiak is officially a Certified Local Government (CLG) as provided in the National Historical Preservation Act. As a CLG, the City is eligible to apply for historic preservation funds, participate directly with the National Register of Historic Places and the Alaska Historical Commission. Additional benefits include technical assistance and training and travel grants to national and state preservation conferences. We are excited to join other Alaska communities with the same prestigious designation.

- The City continues to evaluate opportunities with the Borough to fund and hire a full-time Joint Emergency Services Administrator position to oversee community-wide planning, training, and other grant related activities. We believe this position is long overdue and we will present to Council with a proposal for next fiscal year.
- Worked with AML/JIA Consultant Greg Russell to conduct staff training. The focus of the training for our public-facing employees was how to deal with difficult customers, aggressive behavior, bad behavior, conflict and de-escalation and communication.
- Marsh McLennan, the City's insurance broker made a courtesy visit to Kodiak in mid-February to provide proposed schedules and renewal strategies for next fiscal year.

## Finance:

 Received the preliminary draft reports of the Letter to the Governing Board and the Financial Statements for City of Kodiak for the year ending June 30, 2022 on March 22nd from Altman Rogers. We are currently reviewing and commenting during the preliminary stages of review. Tentative plan is to present to Council during April work session.

## **Fire Department:**

- Since January 1, 2023 to March 21, 2023 the Kodiak Fire Department (KFD) has answered 236 Ambulance and 74 Fire calls.
- In partnership with UAF, participated and helped facilitate the inaugural online EMT II
  certification class. KFD had two staff members participating in the class who successfully
  completed and passed the State Exam.
- KFD is the City's point of contact for hosting the Kodiak Tsunami Operations Workshop to be held March 28-30, 2023 at the Best Western Kodiak Inn. Planners from the State DHS&EM, National Weather Service, UAF Geophysical Institute, USCG, ADEC will be present to conduct a number of workshops and facilitated table-top exercises. See attached agenda for more information.
- Working with local stakeholders for the development and implementation of a local firefighter and EMS cadet training program for Kodiak.

## **Engineering:**

Work continues on several projects including:

- Lift Station #5 and Force Main Replacement Bid opening scheduled for March 29, 2023. Construction to be complete no later than December 31, 2024.
- CT Tank Coating DAMA Industrial, tank coating contractor, is scheduled to start on first tank May 1, 2023. Second tank to be completed in 2024. Highmark Marine will do quality control.
- Baranof Park Improvements Project (Ice Rink and Track enclosure) Construction continuing. Hockey rink scheduled to close March 27<sup>th</sup>. Final completion October 31, 2023.
- Public Works Warehouse Extension design/build planning underway. Construction tentatively complete by October 31, 2023.

- 2023 Paving Plan preliminary planning underway for summer 2023 construction.
- KPD Security Controls Upgrade notice to proceed issued September 19, 2022.
- KPD HVAC DDC Upgrade RSA preparing RFP scope in preparation for advertising
- Shelikof slide initial condition assessment completed. Await guidance from DOT/PF to make repairs during spring/summer 2023.
- Water & Sewer Phase VII Hemlock Street Design with DOWL approximately 80% complete.

## Port & Harbors:

Work continues on several projects with Engineering Department including:

- St. Herman Harbor (SHH) Replacement
  - o PND Engineers prepared initial scoping documents necessary for grant applications and state/federal funding requests in January 2023.
  - o Received a fee proposal on March 17<sup>th</sup> for engineering services in support of 35% design and permitting for the float replacement project.
  - City staff preparing scoping documents for maintenance projects to be executed in advance of replacement.
- St. Paul Harbor Boat Launch Ramp ADF&G grant application for \$2M approved. Working
  on a draft cooperative agreement and design procurement managed by ADF&G and will be
  complete later this year. Construction in 2024.
- Fender Pile Replacement (Dock 1 & Oscar's dock) Design is 100% complete. PND is preparing pile material specification so the City can order materials. USACE Permit in place and Invitation for Bid (IFB) pending. Construction scheduled for summer 2023.
- Pier II Anodes preconstruction conference scheduled for March 23, 2023. Work scheduled to be done in April 2023.
- Dock 1 re-decking City furnishing materials. Invitation for Bid (IFB) pending. Construction scheduled for summer 2023.
- St. Paul Harbor Fire Suppression System Repairs resolution of pressure certification and replacement of pipe hangars pending.
- Shipyard High Mast Light Foundation Repair repair submittals approved. Repair schedule pending.

## Library:

- KPLA Annual Meeting held on March 11, 2023.
- Visiting anthropologist and author Margaret Willson in Kodiak on March 22, 2023. Ms. Willson is the third visiting author to the library this month.
- Fan Con 2023 hosted on March 17 & 18 was a huge success! Congrats to Library staff!!

## Parks & Recreation:

- The ice rink closed for the season on 3/21/23.






