KODIAK, ALASKA, FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: June 30, 2020

The information received from the Alaska Department of Health and Social Services about the two COVID-19 cases reported on Friday, June 26th has been updated to confirm that the individuals are both nonresidents. One case is classified as community spread, from close contact with a previously confirmed case; the other is travel related. The individuals are isolated and being monitored; the contact investigation is complete.

IF YOU ARE FEELING SICK OR SUSPECT THAT YOU MAY BE INFECTED WITH THE VIRUS that causes COVID-19, you should remain at home and contact your health care provider; you should also take steps to help prevent the disease from spreading to people in your home and community.

If you are <u>not</u> sick, please continue to take precautionary measures to stay healthy:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, or cough or sneeze into your elbow.
- Wear a mask/face covering when out in public.
- Maintain social distancing (keep six feet of distance between you and others) when out in public.
- Keep your social circles and gatherings small and limited.
- Clean frequently touched surfaces and objects daily (e.g., tables, countertops, light switches, doorknobs, and cabinet handles) using a regular household detergent and water.
