KODIAK, ALASKA, FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: October 1, 2020

The Alaska Department of Health and Social Services has notified the Kodiak Emergency Operations Center of positive test results for COVID-19 associated with the Kodiak Island Borough.

Two (2) new cases have been reported for the Kodiak Island Borough. Both cases are Kodiak residents who are close contacts of a positive case announced earlier this week. The individuals are in isolation. Close contacts of these individuals have been identified and contacted by Public Health. Staff from the Department of Public Health will remain in contact with the individuals to ensure self-isolation and care. This brings the case count associated with the Kodiak Island Borough to eighty (80); seven (7) cases are currently classified as active locally.

To address the recent cases in our community, the Emergency Services Director will be giving a live community update today, Thursday, October 1, 2020, at 12:00 PM. This update will be broadcast in the following formats:
