KODIAK, ALASKA, FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: November 27, 2020

The Kodiak Emergency Operations Center has been notified of positive test results for COVID-19 associated with the Kodiak Island Borough.

Fifteen (15) new cases have been reported for the Kodiak Island Borough.

- These 15 cases were tested on 11/25/20
 - Two cases are travel related
 - Nine cases are close contacts of previously reported cases
 - o Three cases are classified as community spread
 - One case is under investigation for contraction of the virus

This brings the case count associated with the Kodiak Island Borough to two hundred and seventy-one (271); ninety-four (94) cases are classified as active.

There are currently three patients hospitalized for COVID-19 and the hospital has activated their surge plans, including standing up additional beds for COVID-postiive patients, and cancelling most outpatient services.

The State of Alaska Department of Health and Social Services has announced that the surge in COVID-19 cases has strained the public health response, creating a backlog in case and contact investigations. **DHSS is urging anyone who receives a positive test result to notify their own close contacts** as soon as possible so individuals can quarantine without delay.

The COVID-19 virus is spreading quickly in our community, please take appropriate precautions to keep yourself and our community healthy.

- Wear a mask when in public, there is a mask mandate in effect.
- Stay home if you are not feeling well!
- When planning travel, plan for a few days off at home and testing before returning to normal activities in case you have carried the virus with you.
- Limit social gatherings and maintain six feet of distance between yourself and others who are not in your household.
