



KODIAK, ALASKA, FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: December 5, 2020

The Kodiak Emergency Operations Center has been notified of positive test results for COVID-19 associated with the Kodiak Island Borough.

Forty-four (44) new cases have been reported for the Kodiak Island Borough.

- One (1) new case not previously reported was tested on 11/28/20, and is considered community transmission
- Two (2) new cases not previously reported were tested on 11/30/20
 - One (1) case is a close contact of a previously reported case
 - One (1) case is considered community transmission
- Five (5) new cases not previously reported were tested on 12/1/20, and are close contacts of previously announced cases
- Seven (7) new cases not previously reported were tested on 12/3/20
 - Four (4) cases are close contacts of previously reported cases
 - Three (3) cases are considered community transmission
- Twenty-nine (29) cases were individuals tested on 12/4/20
 - Two (2) cases are travel-related
 - Seventeen (17) cases are close contacts of previously reported cases
 - Ten (10) cases are considered community transmission

This brings the case count associated with the Kodiak Island Borough to four hundred and seventy-eight (478); one hundred and ninety (190) cases are classified as active locally. Twenty-three (23) individuals have completed their isolation period and been removed from the active list.

The total number of local COVID-19 hospitalizations to date is twelve (12); two (2) patients are currently hospitalized locally.

DHSS Is urging anyone who receives a positive test result to <u>notify their own close</u> <u>contacts</u> as soon as possible so individuals can quarantine without delay.
