## KODIAK, ALASKA, FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: January 4, 2021

The Kodiak Emergency Operations Center has received new COVID-19 case information for the Kodiak Island Borough.

Nine (9) new cases have been reported for the Kodiak Island Borough.

- One (1) new case was tested on 12/30/20
  - This case is a close contact of a previously reported case
- Seven (7) new cases were tested on 12/31/20
  - One (1) case is travel related
  - Four (4) cases are close contacts of previously reported cases
  - Two (2) cases are considered community transmission
- One (1) new case was tested on 1/2/21
  - This case is a close contact of a previously reported case

This brings the current case count associated with the Kodiak Island Borough to nine hundred and twenty-one (921); forty-one (41) cases are classified as active locally.

To date, there have been a total number of thirty-seven (37) local hospitalizations and five (5) deaths associated with COVID-19; one (1) patient is currently hospitalized in Kodiak.

The COVID-19 virus continues to spread in our community; please take appropriate precautions to keep yourself and our community healthy.

- Wear a mask when in public; there is a mask mandate in effect.
- Stay home if you are not feeling well!
- When planning travel, plan for a few days off at home and testing before returning to normal activities in case you have carried the virus with you.
- Limit social gatherings and maintain six feet of distance between yourself and others who are not in your household.
