



**KODIAK, ALASKA, FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: January 14, 2021**

The Kodiak Emergency Operations Center has received new COVID-19 case information for the Kodiak Island Borough.

**Six (6) new cases have been reported for the Kodiak Island Borough.**

- **Three (3) new cases were tested on 1/11/21**
  - **Two (2) cases are close contacts of previously reported cases**
  - **One (1) case is travel-related**
  - **All three (3) cases were tested off island and remain off island; as such, they will not be included in the local active case count**
- **Three (3) new cases were tested on 1/13/21**
  - **Two (2) cases are close contacts of previously reported cases**
  - **One (1) case is considered community transmission**

This brings the current case count associated with the Kodiak Island Borough to nine hundred and eighty-five (985); fifty-one (51) cases are classified as active locally.

To date, there have been a total number of thirty-nine (39) local hospitalizations and five (5) deaths associated with COVID-19; there are no active cases currently hospitalized in Kodiak.

**The COVID-19 virus is highly contagious and continues to spread in our community; please continue to take appropriate precautions to keep yourself and our community healthy.**

- **Wear a mask when in public; there is a mask mandate in effect.**
- **Stay home and away from others if you are not feeling well!**
- **When planning travel, plan for a few days off at home and testing before returning to normal activities in case you have carried the virus with you.**
- **Limit social gatherings and maintain six feet of distance between yourself and others who are not in your household.**
