### **KODIAK, ALASKA, FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: January 26, 2021**

The Kodiak Emergency Operations Center has received new COVID-19 case information for the Kodiak Island Borough.

#### **Four (4) new cases have been reported for the Kodiak Island Borough.**

- **One (1) new case was tested on 1/19/21**
  - **This case is a close contact of a previously reported case**
- **One (1) new case was tested on 1/22/21**
  - **This case is considered community transmission**
- **One (1) new case was tested on 1/23/21**
  - **This case is a close contact of a previously reported case**
- **One (1) new case was tested on 1/25/21**
  - **This case is a close contact of a previously reported case**

This brings the current case count associated with the Kodiak Island Borough to one thousand and twenty-nine (1029); twenty-one (21) cases are classified as active locally.

To date, there have been a total number of forty-two (42) local hospitalizations and five (5) deaths associated with COVID-19; one (1) active case is currently hospitalized in Kodiak.

**The COVID-19 virus is highly contagious and continues to spread in our community; please continue to take appropriate precautions to keep yourself and our community healthy.**

- **Wear a mask when in public; there is a mask mandate in effect.**
- **Stay home and away from others if you are not feeling well!**
- **When planning travel, plan for a few days off at home and testing before returning to normal activities in case you have carried the virus with you.**
- **Limit social gatherings and maintain six feet of distance between yourself and others who are not in your household.**
