KODIAK, ALASKA, FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: April 19, 2021

The Kodiak Emergency Operations Center has received new COVID-19 case information for the Kodiak Island Borough.

Two (2) new cases have been reported for the Kodiak Island Borough.

- One (1) case was tested on 4/15/21
 - This case is travel related
- o One (1) case was tested on 4/16/21
 - This case is a close contact of a previously reported case

This brings the current case count associated with the Kodiak Island Borough to one thousand, one hundred and eight (1108); six (6) cases are classified as active locally; there are no active cases currently hospitalized in Kodiak.

To date, there have been a total number of forty-five (45) local hospitalizations and five (5) deaths associated with COVID-19.

The COVID-19 virus is highly contagious and is still present in our community; please continue to take appropriate precautions to keep yourself and our community healthy.

- Wear a mask when in public; masks are strongly recommended.
- Stay home and away from others if you are not feeling well!

The Kodiak Emergency Operations Center has received new COVID-19 case information for the Kodiak Island Borough.

Five (5) new cases have been reported for the Kodiak Island Borough.

- Two (2) cases were tested on 4/6/21
 - Both cases are non-residents who are close contacts of a previously reported case
- Three (3) cases were tested on 4/9/21
 - Two (2) cases are close contacts of a previously reported case
 - One (1) case is considered community transmission

This brings the current case count associated with the Kodiak Island Borough to one thousand, one hundred and six (1106); twelve (12) cases are classified as active locally.

To date, there have been a total number of forty-five (45) local hospitalizations and five (5) deaths associated with COVID-19; there is one case currently hospitalized in Kodiak.

The COVID-19 virus is highly contagious and is still present in our community; please continue to take appropriate precautions to keep yourself and our community healthy.
