



KODIAK, ALASKA, FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: August 30, 2021

The Kodiak Emergency Operations Center has received new COVID-19 case information for the Kodiak Island Borough.

Nineteen (19) new cases have been reported for the Kodiak Island Borough.

- One (1) case was tested on 8/6/21
 - This case is believed to have been tested out of state
- One (1) case was tested on 8/21/21
 This case is believed to have been

 This case is a close contact of a previously reported case
 - One (1) case was tested on 8/26/21
 - This case is a close contact of a previously reported case
- Ten (10) cases were tested on 8/27/21
 - Four (4) cases are close contacts of previously reported cases
 - Two (2) cases are classified as community spread
 - One (1) case is travel related
 - Three (3) cases have unknown transmission pending further investigation
- Four (4) cases were tested on 8/28/21
 - All four cases are close contacts of previously reported cases

The total case count associated with the Kodiak Island Borough is now one thousand, five hundred and ninety-one (1591) with Ninety-two (92) cases currently classified as active. There have been sixty-nine (69) local hospitalizations associated with COVID-19; one (1) active case is currently hospitalized in Kodiak, and one hospitalized patient was flown off-island for a higher level of care. Please note that this patient had to be transferred out-of-state due to the unavailability of hospital beds in-state.
