KODIAK, ALASKA, FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: September 1, 2021

The Kodiak Emergency Operations Center has received new COVID-19 case information for the Kodiak Island Borough.

Eighteen (18) new cases have been reported for the Kodiak Island Borough.

- One (1) case was tested on 8/21/21
 - This case is travel related and was tested off-island
- One (1) case was tested on 8/25/21
 - This case is a close contact of a previously reported case
- Two (2) cases were tested on 8/26/21
 - o One (1) case is travel related and was tested off-island
 - o One (1) case is classified as community spread
- One (1) case was tested on 8/30/21
 - o This case is a close contact of a previously reported case
- Thirteen (13) cases were tested on 8/31/21
 - Two (2) cases are travel related
 - Four (4) cases are close contacts of previously reported cases
 - Seven (7) cases are classified as community spread

The total case count associated with the Kodiak Island Borough is now one thousand, six hundred and twenty-five (1625) with one hundred and four (104) cases currently classified as active. There have been sixty-nine (69) local hospitalizations associated with COVID-19 and there are no active cases currently hospitalized in Kodiak. Seven (7) deaths associated with COVID-19 have been officially reported for the Kodiak Island Borough; the information about one new death is believed to be a Kodiak resident who was off-island and identified in a review by the State of Alaska; and sadly, we have received an official report of the recent death of another Kodiak resident.
