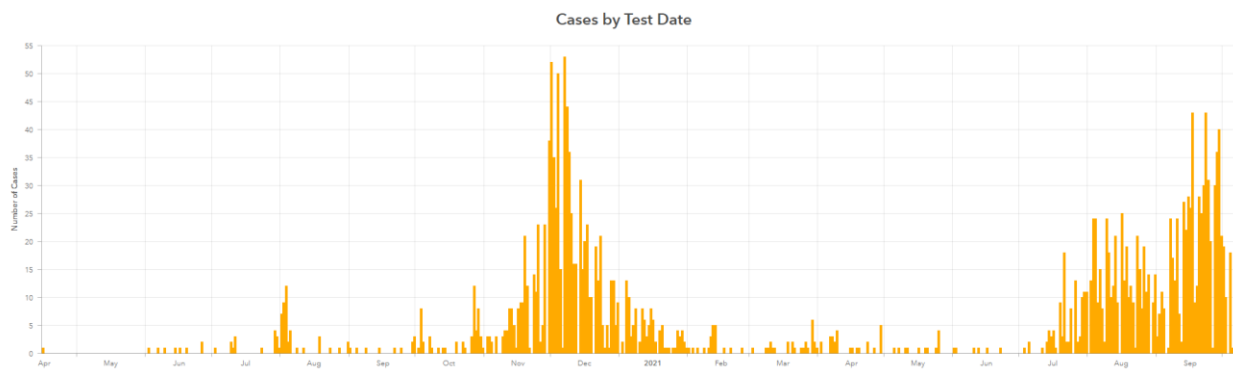
### **KODIAK, ALASKA, FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: October 5, 2021**

The Kodiak Emergency Operations Center has received new COVID-19 case information for the Kodiak Island Borough.

**Twenty-two (22) new cases have been reported for the Kodiak Island Borough.**

- One (1) case was tested on 9/30/21
- One (1) case was tested on 10/1/21
- One (1) case was tested on 10/2/21
- Eighteen (18) cases were tested on 10/4/21
- One (1) case was tested on 10/5/21

The Kodiak Public Health Office is now classifying the means of transmission for all COVID-19 cases in our community as community spread.



The total case count associated with the Kodiak Island Borough is now two thousand, two hundred and seventy-two (2272) with one hundred and ninety-four (194) cases currently classified as active. There have been eighty-four (84) local hospitalizations associated with COVID-19 and there is one (1) active case currently hospitalized in Kodiak. Seven (7) deaths associated with COVID-19 have been officially reported for the Kodiak Island Borough.
