### **KODIAK, ALASKA, FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: October 13, 2021**

The Kodiak Emergency Operations Center has received new COVID-19 case information for the Kodiak Island Borough.

**Ten (10) new cases have been reported for the Kodiak Island Borough.**

- Two (2) cases were tested on 10/11/21
- Eight (8) cases were tested on 10/12/21

The Kodiak Public Health Office is classifying the means of transmission for all COVID-19 cases in our community as community spread.

The total case count associated with the Kodiak Island Borough is now two thousand, three hundred and seventy-nine (2379) with one hundred and twenty-two (122) cases currently classified as active. There have been eighty-seven (87) local hospitalizations associated with COVID-19 and there are two (2) active cases currently hospitalized in Kodiak. Seven (7) deaths associated with COVID-19 have been officially reported for the Kodiak Island Borough.
