KODIAK, ALASKA, FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: October 14, 2021

The Kodiak Emergency Operations Center has received new COVID-19 case information for the Kodiak Island Borough.

Forty-seven (47) new cases have been reported for the Kodiak Island Borough.

- One (1) case was tested on 10/4/21
- One (1) case was tested on 10/5/21
- Four (4) cases were tested on 10/7/21
- One (1) case was tested on 10/9/21
- One (1) case was tested on 10/11/21
- Twenty-six (26) cases were tested on 10/12/21
 - o One (1) case was a non-resident
- Thirteen (13) cases were tested on 10/13/21

The Kodiak Public Health Office is classifying the means of transmission for all COVID-19 cases in our community as community spread.

The total case count associated with the Kodiak Island Borough is now two thousand, four hundred and twenty-six (2426) with one hundred and sixty-nine (169) cases currently classified as active. There have been eighty-seven (87) local hospitalizations associated with COVID-19 and there is one (1) active case currently hospitalized in Kodiak. Seven (7) deaths associated with COVID-19 have been officially reported for the Kodiak Island Borough.
