KODIAK, ALASKA, FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: October 26, 2021

The Kodiak Emergency Operations Center has received new COVID-19 case information for the Kodiak Island Borough.

Twenty-five (25) new cases have been reported for the Kodiak Island Borough over several test dates.

- One (1) case was tested on 10/14/21
- One (1) case was tested on 10/15/21
- One (1) case was tested on 10/16/21
- Two (2) cases were tested on 10/18/21
- One (1) case was tested on 10/19/21
- Three (3) cases were tested on 10/20/21
- Two (2) cases were tested on 10/21/21
- Six (6) cases were tested on 10/22/21
- Three (3) cases were tested on 10/23/21
- One (1) case was tested on 10/24/21
- Three (3) cases were tested on 10/25/21
- One (1) case was tested on 10/26/21

All COVID-19 cases in our community are currently classified as community spread.

The total case count associated with the Kodiak Island Borough is now two thousand, five hundred and ninety-two (2592) with one hundred and twelve (112) cases currently classified as active. There have been eighty-nine (89) local hospitalizations associated with COVID-19 and there are two (2) active cases currently hospitalized in Kodiak. Nine (9) deaths associated with COVID-19 have been officially reported for the Kodiak Island Borough.
